I'm pleased to present this year's Annual Report of Pegasus' 47<sup>th</sup> year of operation. I am also pleased to report that, after three challenging years, Pegasus remains financially strong, operationally safe and well governed. Our programs continued throughout the year, despite threats from Covid-19 and some extraordinary weather patterns (which have certainly not dampened the Pegasus spirit)!

This year, Pegasus delivered 900 sessions to 113 participants. This would not have been possible without the dedication and support of our amazing team of staff, volunteers and coaches who continue to give of their time week after week, often going above and beyond for our participants. I've been particularly impressed by their collective ability to work hard, support each other and keep going. This is what makes Pegasus special and so thanks must go to them for all that they do.

We've continued to benefit from the generosity of our sponsors, partners and donors, whose support is essential to our operation. This year, our events and fundraising activities saw our sponsors, partners and donors contribute over \$450,000 to Pegasus. Our thanks go to them for their continued support and belief that what we do makes a difference.

Our organisational capability has been enhanced this year with the completion of our indoor arena resurfacing and the extensive experience brought to the Horse Manager role by Kirsten Baker. Our partnership with Galilee School, through Communities at Work, has delivered meaningful projects for their farm-based activities and we trademarked our new unmounted 'Horse Abilities' program which has allowed us to extend our reach.

Thanks must also go to our Board members, who give freely of their time and expertise, and who strive to secure Pegasus' future through their ongoing commitment to good governance and collaboration.

I am also pleased to announce the launch of our 2022-2027 Strategy which can be viewed at <https://pegasusact.com.au/strategic-plan/>. While the Strategy outlines our broad objectives for the next five years, there is much to be done operationally to bring it to life.

In the meantime, we continue to develop abilities.

## FROM THE CEO

It gives me great pleasure to share with you all the year that was, a year where we could finally plan and see a future beyond Covid lockdowns.

Or so we thought as the ACT was put into a snap lockdown on 12 August; with only five hours notice the team at Pegasus worked frantically to put things in place to ensure our herd could be properly looked after, and that we could notify all our volunteers and families that programs were to stop immediately. It was nine weeks with staff working from home, only coming in to conduct horse welfare checks and property maintenance. A huge thank you needs to go out to all the team who worked tirelessly throughout this time, without our regular number of volunteers attending a lot of the workload fell onto the staff. The hay had to keep going out and the manure kept piling up, but in true Pegasus style, we made it work.

However, we were fortunate to have celebrated the horse's birthday the week prior, although we couldn't invite all our supporters, our participants had a weeklong celebration with games, activities, and of course the giant hay cake. Thank you to everyone who helped us celebrate our amazing ponies and horses.

Part way into term four we were back into the swing of programs full of smiles, laughter, and catching up with friends again. The remainder of the year carried on without incident, covid cases were causing some disruptions to classes but the ability to have avoided an outbreak within Pegasus is testament to the professionalism and respect of the situation from all the team and families.

Open Day was once again a victim of Covid and did not occur during the financial year, this does have a direct effect on fundraising, but it is also about the community engagement we were all missing so much. We were fortunate though to have still been able to hold our annual charity race day and golf day supported Corkhill Bros and 2 Constitution Avenue respectively. Two very important events of the fundraising calendar and a big thank you to all the businesses and individuals who supported these events.

Christmas rocked around and as we all gathered for our annual Christmas Party and Volunteer Appreciation Event, kindly supported once again by Parbery. Families, volunteers and staff enjoyed an afternoon of games, food, and awards. We also had a very special visit from the man himself, Santa.

Throughout the year I would have to say April was the highlight for me after being invited to join RDA Australia in meeting with Her Royal Highness Princess Anne, The Princess Royal, during her

visit to Australia for the Royal Easter Show. Held on the grounds of Government House in Sydney, the evening was a wonderful opportunity for Her Royal Highness to meet with representatives of the countless organisations in which she is a patron for. Joined by other members of RDA from around Australia, Pegasus was excited to have been able to share this experience with two of our long-time families. HRH Princess Anne was very generous with her time, making sure to meet and talk with everyone there that evening. Truly a once in a lifetime opportunity and one I will cherish for many years to come.

A lot of exciting new projects also occurred during this time, none more so than our new arena surface upgrade. Generously supported financially by ACT Sport and Recreation, we were able to invest in removing the old surface, repairing the subbase and installing the latest in surfaces, a mix of sand and shredded carpet, which in turn not only provided a softer surface but has reduced our dust levels to almost zero. But even with the financial support we still needed assistance from local businesses to make it happen; thank you to AG Garden services, Bumble Bee Excavations and Corkhill Bros for their support and assistance in labor and materials.

2022 also saw the launch of our new website, with the existing website becoming outdated it was time for something new and fresh, Fiber to the rescue. A local Canberra business, Fiber specialises in website design and marketing. The new website was not just a simple refresh, it was an all-new build from the ground up and includes capabilities for future integration of our systems. A big thank you to Fiber who donated their time and expertise to make this happen.

This year we also launched our farm skills program with Galilee School, which is specifically designed for disengaged and vulnerable young people in years 7-12 in the ACT and surrounds. Galilee and Pegasus met back in 2021 to look at ways in which students and Pegasus could work together. From this the farm skills program came about where students come to Pegasus one day a week to help on the property; real life jobs including erecting new fencing and repairs, fixing or installing water troughs and irrigation plumbing, gardening, painting, and any other job that helps to keep the property up to standard. It is hoped these jobs will help students identify and connect with opportunities after they leave school, building their confidence, while helping them identify what they are good at and how those fit into the workplace.

With so much happening within Pegasus I invite you to read through this year's annual report and see all the amazing projects, activities, and stories that make Pegasus who we are. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank my team, Chai, Janelle, Jo, and Kirsten who all help keep the wheels turning; thank you to all our wonderful coaches, Andrew, Brooke, Cathy, Chris, Janelle, John, Lynne, Margo, Steph, and Yolanda who give tirelessly week in, week out, delivering quality classes to our participants. To all our volunteers who make sure our horses are looked after, participants are safe, and all that poo is picked up; Pegasus could not operate without you all. Paul, Adrian, Brian, and Ian who make sure the fences are up, the gardens are beautiful, and all those jobs that keep a farm operating, thank you. And the Board who have helped reinvigorate and govern the organisation and supported my role and given me the tools to help lead Pegasus into its next chapter, thank you.






